Message from the Mayor



As Mayor, I assure you that the Council's priority is to protect the health and well-being of our community, Volunteers and staff.

We understand many within our community are experiencing financial hardship. The Council has adopted a package of measures to support ratepayers, residents, business operators, sporting clubs and other local groups that use Council facilities who are experiencing financial hardship.

These measures, which apply for the remainder of the 2019–2020 financial year, are just the beginning.

In the coming weeks, the Council will consider additional support as part of the draft 2020–2021 Budget to take effect from 1 July 2020.

In the meantime, if you are experiencing hardship regarding the payment of rates, fees or other payments, I encourage you to contact the Council to discuss your particular circumstances with one of our staff members.

With COVID-19 impacting our economy, the need to support local businesses has never been more important. Where possible, I encourage you to continue to support our local businesses, while exercising care and caution in relation to hygiene and personal contact, and following all lockdown measures.

Please, take every necessary measure to help stop the spread of COVID-19. Practice good hygiene and comply with social distancing protocols at all times.

COVID-19 *Reduce the spread*

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is a respiratory illness caused by a new virus.

Symptoms range from a mild cough to pneumonia. Some people recover easily, others may get very sick very quickly.

From 16 April to 30 April 2020, all South Australians with symptoms of COVID-19 will be able to get tested as part of a two week testing blitz.

Patients who meet the following clinical criteria can be tested for COVID-19:

Fever OR chills

 (in the absence of an alternative illness that explains these symptoms)

OR

 An acute respiratory infection (e.g. cough, sore throat, runny nose or shortness of breath) You can contact your GP about getting tested for COVID-19. Your GP clinic will ask you about your symptoms to determine if you need to be tested. If you do qualify for a test, your doctor will give you instructions on what to do, which may include remaining in your car until someone can come outside to take a swab test, or they may provide you with a referral to attend a <u>drive-through</u> <u>testing clinic</u>.

People with COVID-19 symptoms can also visit a dedicated COVID-19 clinic to be assessed and tested. You don't need to call ahead or make an appointment.

Drive-through Testing

Patients need to get a 'specimen collection request form' from their GP to access the drive-through testing service.

Drive-through collection centres have been established so that tests can be taken with the patient still in the vehicle, minimising the risk of spreading the infection.

Drive-through testing will support GPs who may not be able to perform the test in their own clinic.

COVID-19 *Reduce the spread*

Social distancing will help keep our community healthy by slowing the spread of infectious diseases such as COVID-19. The more space between you and others, the harder it is for a virus to spread.



Sanitise your hands wherever possible, including entering and leaving buildings



Use 'tap and pay' rather than cash



Travel at quiet times and try to avoid crowds



Sit in the back seat of taxis and Ubers



Wash your hands frequently with soap and water, before and after eating, and after going to the toilet



Regularly clean and disinfect high touch surfaces



Cover your cough and sneeze, dispose of tissues and use alcohol-based hand sanitiser



Maintain a 1.5 metre distance between you and others



If unwell, avoid contact with others, self-isolate and contact your doctor

Our Services

The Council continues to respond to State and Federal Government directives and take proactive measures to ensure the safety of our community during COVID-19 conditions by limiting, postponing or suspending services, programs and events.

The Norwood Town Hall will remain open, subject to any Federal and/or State Government restrictions.

The Council will continue to deliver a number of essential services including:

Council Meetings and essential Committee Meetings

Council and essential committee meetings will continue, however Elected Members will participate in the meetings electronically.

Members of the public can view the meetings via a live stream on the <u>Council's Facebook</u> page or via the <u>Council's website</u>.



Non-essential community and Volunteer services

All non-essential community and Volunteer services have ceased, with the exception of the Justice of the Peace service, which will continue at this stage.

Justice of the Peace services will continue to operate from Norwood Town Hall, 175 The Parade Norwood.



Citizenship Ceremonies

Due to COVID-19 restrictions it is not possible for traditional, in-person citizenship ceremonies to be held.

The Federal Government is trialling one-on-one citizenship ceremonies via a secure video link for those already approved for Australian Citizenship, with alternative arrangements to be made for those who can not access the internet.

Community services

The Council's range of social and wellbeing programs such as Lunch at the Pub, Excursions, Stepping Out and Come and Try have been suspended.



Council events, exhibitions, and library and cultural heritage programs

All Council events and social programs have been suspended during this period.



Council facilities for hire

The Norwood Concert Hall, Don Pyatt Hall, St Peters Youth Centre, St Peters Town Hall Complex and Payneham Community Centre are closed in accordance with Federal and State Government guidelines regarding indoor public gatherings.



Playgrounds and outdoor exercise equipment

All outdoor playgrounds, gym/exercise equipment, all drinking fountains and outdoor barbecues located on all reserves are temporarily closed.

All parks and reserves are open for daily exercise, but please remember to maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when using the parks and reserves and limit gatherings in accordance with Federal and State Government restrictions.



Swimming centres

The Payneham Memorial Swimming Centre closed on Sunday 22 March—the scheduled season closing date.

The Norwood Swimming Centre closed at 8am on Wednesday 25 March in accordance with Federal Government restrictions.



Temporary parking controls

We understand that this is a difficult and challenging time for residents, visitors and businesses.

As such, we are taking a more flexible approach to the management of time limited parking controls throughout the City for the time being. At the same time we ask that you be considerate of others' needs in respect to parking and access.

This will allow residents and visitors to go about their shopping and conduct business, and also releases some of the pressure which both businesses and shoppers are experiencing during COVID-19.

However, parking restrictions for disabled spaces, clearways, permit zones and bike lanes will continue to be monitored and enforced.



Libraries

Library buildings are closed but there are other ways to get your library item while in isolation.

The Council's Libraries are providing a Click, Call and Collect service. Customers will be able to reserve library items by phone, via the Library catalogue on the Council's website or by using the free Libraries SA app.

The Council's three libraries at Norwood, Payneham and St Peters—which closed on 25 March—will accommodate collections of reserved library items only via designated collection points at the entrance of each library.

Customers must nominate which of the three Libaries they would like to collect their items from as part of the reservation process.

Collecting your library items

Customers will receive a text message, email or letter notification when items are ready to be collected.

Items will be packed into bags and can be collected from Library entrances at a dedicated collection point. No access into the libraries will be permitted.

Collection points will be open on weekdays only. Please check the opening times on the right.

Returning your library items

All library items must be returned through the return chutes located at all three libraries. However after hours returns are only available at Payneham and St Peters Libraries.

Once returned, all library items will be subject to a five-day quarantine process before they are available to customers

Online Catalogue

Access the library collection online for free!

Though the Council's Libraries buildings will remain closed due to COVID-19 restrictions, library card holders can also access plenty of books and online learning opportunities from any mobile device through the Libraries SA app.

The <u>online catalogue</u>, available on the app, offers a huge range of books, digital magazines and newspapers, and online learning opportunities. The app can be downloaded for free from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

Assistance for our Community

The Council continues to review, respond and adapt to implications of the COVID-19 pandemic, with the most recent initiative being the introduction of a Financial Assistance Package aimed at assisting ratepayers, residents, business operators, sporting clubs and other local groups that use Council facilities, who are experiencing hardship due to the Federal and State Government restrictions which have been introduced as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Financial Assistance Package takes into account a number of factors which the Council will continue to review as the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic evolve.

While most financial assistance packages will be delivered by Federal and State Governments, the Council's package focuses on services and initiatives that the Council has direct control over.

Ratepayers and property owners

- Waiving of interest and fines for any unpaid 2019–2020 Fourth Quarter Rates instalments.
- The Council will continue to assess applications from ratepayers who are experiencing financial hardship as a result of COVID-19 on a case-by-case basis and provide assistance that is best suited to individual circumstances.

Local businesses

- Discretionary rebates equal to the 2019–2020 Fourth Quarter payment for businesses located within The Parade Precinct that are required to pay The Parade Separate Rate. (Note: only properties located within The Parade Precinct pay a Separate Rate).
- Refunds of the June Quarter (ie from 23 March to 30 June 2020) Outdoor Dining Permit fees for Outdoor Dining Permit Holders that have paid in full and providing a credit for those who have not paid in full; and
- Outdoor Dining Permit Holders required to make a payment for the installation of bollards associated with their outdoor dining area will have payments deferred for three months to June 2020, with these payment arrangements reviewed at 30 June 2020.

Information for businesses

The Federal Government and key health organisations are providing information and assistance for all kinds of businesses to help them plan and respond to COVID-19.

To assist businesses find the information they need, we have collated a list of official website links, which are available on the <u>Council's website</u>



Local sporting clubs, Organisations and Leaseholders

- financial commitments for sporting clubs and organisations using Council facilities have been waived for a period of three months to 30 June 2020.
- loans and co-contribution agreements have been deferred for the same period with a review of these arrangements after 30 June 2020.
- Arrangements for tenants of all Council buildings and facilities will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, in line with the Council's current financial hardship policy and principles set out by the Federal Cabinet.

Home and Community Care Services

 Residents who access the Council's Home and Community Care Services and are experiencing difficulty making payment for the services which have been invoiced will have payments deferred for a period of up to three months. This current suite of measures is just the beginning of support which will be offered by the Council and addresses the period to 30 June 2020. Over the coming weeks, the Council will consider a Financial Assistance Package to manage the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic during the 2020–2021 financial year which will be considered as part of the draft 2020–2021 Annual Budget

Ratepayers, both residential property owners and commercial property owners, who are experiencing financial hardship due to the restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, are encouraged to contact the Council sooner rather than later to discuss their particular situation.
