

Welcome to the Autumn 2022 edition of Look East



With COVID-19 restrictions easing, the Council believes the negative impact of the past few months on the local economy cannot be ignored.

As such, earlier this year, the Council approved a third assistance package to help those business sectors, particularly hospitality, which have been most affected.

The package, which includes rate rebates and waiving fees for outdoor dining licenses, aims to help reduce the costs of doing business in the current environment.

Meanwhile, the Council has also taken serious steps to better manage, preserve, promote and celebrate our City's heritage by resolving to develop a Built Heritage Strategy and Action Plan.

Due to be completed by June this year, the Strategy will clearly set out the Council's priorities and values, as well as provide clarity for the community

in understanding the Council's heritage agenda into the future.

With 2022 being an election year, I strongly encourage all residents and ratepayers to participate in the democratic process.

While most of the attention will be given to the State and Federal elections in the coming weeks, the Local Government election in November is your opportunity to make yourself heard about grassroots issues and who you want to represent you on the Council for the next four years.

The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters is also committed to mitigating the impacts of climate change and creating a more sustainable community.

This is in line with the Council's Strategic Management Plan, *CityPlan 2030: Shaping our Future* which incorporates four key Outcomes—Social Equity, Cultural Vitality, Economic Prosperity and Environmental Sustainability.

The Council has committed to achieving zero corporate carbon emissions by 2030, which has led to the development of the Council's Corporate Emissions Reduction Plan.

I am therefore pleased to advise that you are reading the Council's first digital edition of Look East. I hope it's an enjoyable read.

NPSP continues to boost and support the local economy

The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters is home to 7000 businesses creating more than 24,300 jobs across the City.

The Council works tirelessly to ensure that businesses in our City receive the support they need in a timely manner in order to deliver real and tangible results.

Third assistance package provides immediate relief for local businesses



The Council recently approved its third assistance package to local businesses impacted by State Government restrictions.

The Council is providing:

- a Discretionary Rebate of the Differential Rate (20%) to all non-residential property owners impacted by the density restrictions introduced by the State Government following the borders opening (i.e. gyms, cinemas, hospitality venues) for the Third Quarter and Final Quarter of 2021–2022;
- waiving of fees for Outdoor Dining Licenses for the period 1 December 2021 to 30 June 2022;
- waiving of all fines and interest charged on the late payment of the 2021–2022 Third and Fourth Quarter Council Rate payments for all non-residential property owners; and
- waiving The Parade Separate Rate for all property owners and businesses impacted by the density restrictions introduced by the State Government following the borders opening (i.e. gyms, cinemas, hospitality venues) for the period commencing 1 December 2021 to 30 June 2022.

Owner of Pavé Cafe, Rimu Good, said the Council’s relief package was a welcomed initiative.

“Trading in the current climate in relation to constant changes to density and seating, has been our biggest challenge during the pandemic,” he said.

“The financial impact to my business and loss of hours for my staff has been very difficult to navigate as a small business owner.”

Café Bravo owner, Nick Venditti, said the Council’s third assistance package was “extremely necessary.”

“The current restrictions, density requirements and isolation rules have reduced turnover significantly,” he said.

“Isolation rules are having a far greater impact on business now, compared to previously and it is essential to receive support such as waiving the outdoor dining licence fee—particularly when rules are in place that reduce the number of customers allowed.”



Parade Precinct Business Boost

If you are a Parade Precinct business owner or operator and could benefit from the expertise or service from another local business—then the Council has the perfect program for you.

The Parade Precinct Business Boost provides eligible Parade Precinct businesses with a one-off \$250 voucher, to put towards one of the following services, provided by a business within the City:

- Business advisory;
- Marketing and communications;
- Content creation (video/photo for website and social media); and
- Health and well-being.

The program is funded by the Council through the Norwood Parade Precinct Committee.

Citizens awarded and welcomed in our City

The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters' Australia Day and Citizenship Ceremony, celebrated the work of a long serving Justice of the Peace, while also welcoming 26 new Australians.

Speaking at the outdoor ceremony on St Peter's Street, Mayor Robert Bria described the tireless dedication of the Council's 2022 Local Citizen of the Year Award, Mr Sudhir Thakur.

Mr Thakur provides weekly Justice of the Peace services to the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters as well as the Campbelltown Council.

During the 2020 COVID pandemic, Mr Thakur played a vital role as one of the two remaining Volunteer Justice of the Peace officers willing to facilitate the continuation and commitment of the Council's Justice of Peace program.

Together with fellow JP Volunteer, Mick Roache, Mr Thakur performed more than 8,000 JP services for people who travelled to the Norwood Town Hall from across the metropolitan area and regional South Australia.

"This meant that unlike many councils – our Council was one of the few locations across Adelaide that was still able to provide the vital service thanks to the help of Mr Thakur," Mayor Bria said.

"As a long serving Volunteer, Mr Thakur has contributed significantly to a range of services across Adelaide

including Meals on Wheels and a TAFE volunteer English tutor for migrants.

"He is an incredibly worthy recipient and I extend my sincere congratulations to Mr Thakur."

Mayor Bria described the day – which included the Australia Day Awards, a performance from the Australian Girls Choir and the Citizenship Ceremony, as a true celebration of Australia, while acknowledging the traditional owners with a special acknowledgement of country.

"For more than 60,000 years this country has been enriched by the wonderful diversity of cultures that has enriched our society," he said.

After reading the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance, 26 residents—from Bangladesh, Canada, China, Hungary, India, Kuwait, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Philippines, United Arab Emirates, and Vietnam—became Australian citizens.

"Citizenship is the life-long invitation to participate in the community life of Australia and on behalf of the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters, I congratulate all the new citizens and I extend my best wishes to you and your families for a healthy, happy and prosperous future," Mayor Bria said.



Protecting our Built Heritage is a priority

The Council is ensuring the protection of the area's built heritage is an absolute priority – with the Built Heritage Strategy and Action Plan to be released by the middle of the year.

The Strategy will set out a medium to long-term plan to preserve and protect local heritage, fund heritage project initiatives and importantly, provide clarity for the community regarding the timeline for Council's heritage agenda.

Local resident and Norwood Residents' Association member, Chris Francis, said she welcomed the Built Heritage Strategy and Action Plan describing it as a "welcome step forward".

"As a co-owner of a local heritage listed property and past president of the Norwood Residents' Association,

I am deeply concerned about the preservation of Norwood's unique, much-loved, but steadily disappearing built heritage," Ms Francis said.

"Sadly, while the majority of our buildings can boast historic merit, less than a third of them have any protection under the new State Government's Planning and Design Code.

If adopted, this framework will help preserve and promote a fragile cultural asset by carefully guiding and prioritising heritage activity.

The sound of music

The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters is partnering with the Norwood Rotary Club to encourage volunteers to take part in an initiative that assists dementia sufferers through the sound of music.

The Music for Dementia program involves providing headsets to dementia sufferers, pre-loaded with music of their choice.

Dementia Australia statistics show that there are about 2000 dementia sufferers in Adelaide's East.

The Music for Dementia program, which will be officially launched on March 16, will be offered to dementia sufferers living in their own home.

Research shows that music reaches memory areas of the brain and dementia sufferers suddenly find they can sing along with the tunes as the music jogs their memory.

Other benefits include reduced stress and depression, reduced agitation, reduced need for medication, improved thinking, feeling, perception and mood as well as social inclusion and respite for carers.

The Rotary Club of Norwood will provide approximately 16 Volunteers initially but more are still required.

Council elections to be held in November 2022

It is the year of elections with State, Federal and Local Government elections being held between now and the end of the year.

While voting in Council Elections is not mandatory, it is extremely important.

Just about everything you interact with in your neighbourhood is connected to the work done by the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters.

Voting in Council Elections is also open to a broader range of people than State and Federal elections.

Even if you are not an Australian citizen, and not on the State (House of Assembly) Electoral Roll, you can vote

in a Council Election as long as you are 18 or over and have lived in the Council area for more than one month. You can also vote in a Council Election if you own a rateable property in the area, regardless of whether you live in it.

Another important difference is that businesses and bodies corporate can vote in Council Elections.
