**With the 2014 Local Government Elections now over and the new Council sworn in, the focus is very much on getting down to the business of governing our City for the next four years.**

There is no doubt that the last four years were a period of considerable achievement with a number of major infrastructure projects being delivered, and important social and planning policies developed to improve the quality of life for our community.

For example, the three stages of the Revitalising St Peters Project – all completed between 2011 and 2014, a new Residential Development Plan, and an award-winning Bike Plan show that the Council understands our community's priorities and is committed to delivering on them.

At the same time the Council also exercised prudent management of its finances with our City consistently having one of the lowest residential

As such, my number one priority as Mayor will be working with the new Council to ensure our City stays on the path of financial sustainability, so it can continue to invest in essential infrastructure and provide the high quality services and programs our community expects year after year.

Looking ahead, the City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters and the Local Government sector more generally is about to enter a very challenging period.

Changes to the level of involvement in the planning process and the end of State-Government funded rate concessions for Pensioners and Seniors Card Holders, have the potential to redefine the role of Councils in South Australia.

Add to this, a review of the *Local Government Act 1999* and the outcomes of the *Councils of the Future Report* all point to a very different environment for Local Government in the near future.

The challenge, therefore, is for all Councils to identify and support key areas of reform, in particular areas where greater accountability and transparency will impact positively on their performance and earn the confidence of the community.

I look forward to this challenge and to working with Elected Members and Council staff to ensure that whatever changes occur, improving the wellbeing of community remains at the centre of everything we do.

In closing, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Elected Members for their dedication to serve our community over the past 12 months. I am also grateful for the professionalism of Council staff and the selfless devotion of the Council's 200 Volunteers.

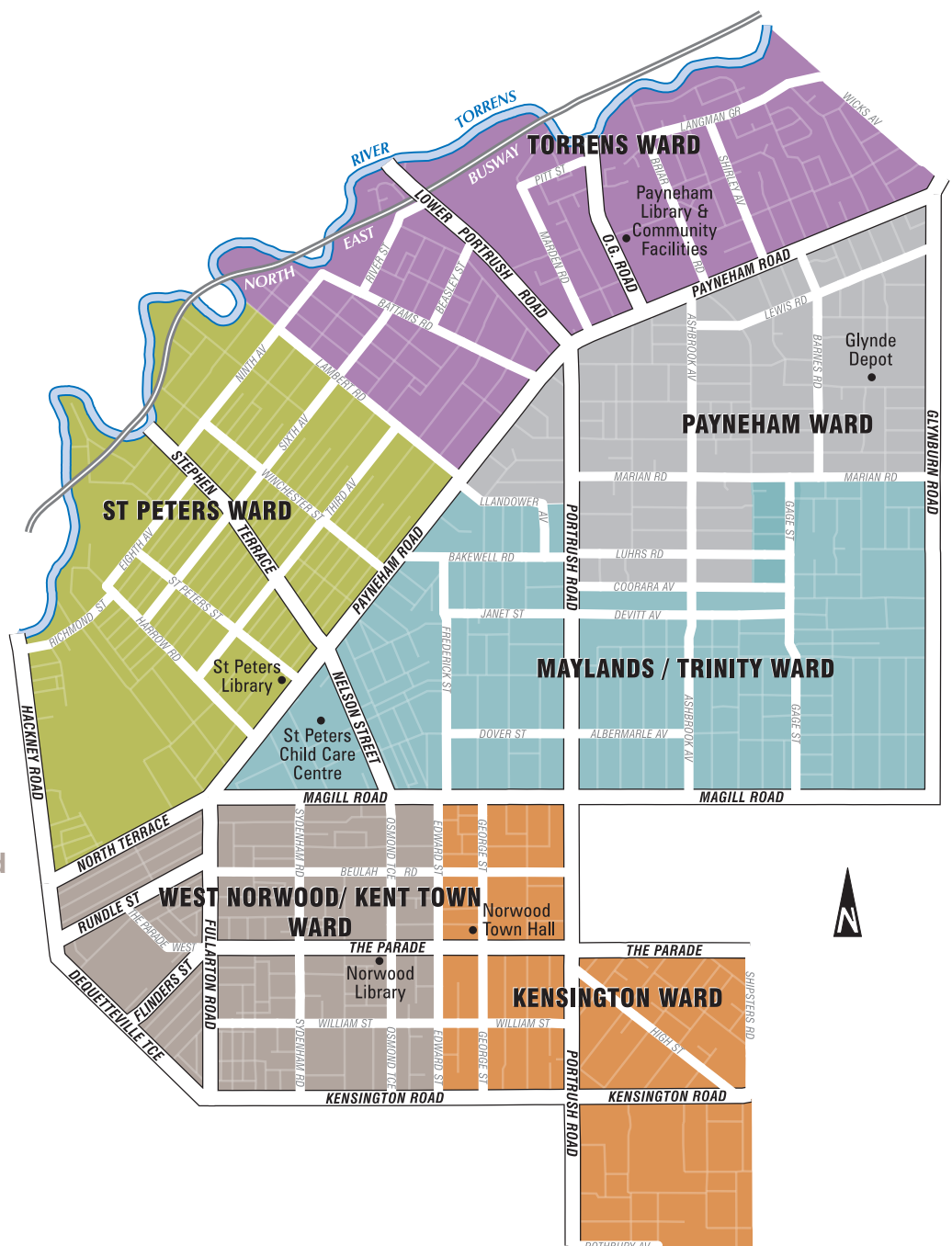

# St Peters Civic Plaza & Avenue of Honour

## 'Fallow'

One hundred years on, it is sobering to look at images of the ANZAC assault at Gallipoli that took place in 1915.

Understanding our connection to these images from the comfortable suburban lives we live today, can be a big concept to grasp.

A contemporary interpretation, *Fallow* provides an opportunity to reflect on the historical significance of ANZAC Day.

The artwork sheds light on the language of hand-drawn trench maps and explores the contrasts of war: its brutality and its long-term and ongoing legacy which has shaped us, making us who we are today and will be tomorrow.

Designed by Gregg Mitchell and Greg Healey of Groundplay, in collaboration with artist, Amy Joy Watson.

**In September, the Council completed the third and final stage of its 'Revitalising St Peters Precinct' Project, with the launch of a new Civic Plaza and Avenue of Honour on St Peters Street.**

The St Peters Civic Plaza and Avenue of Honour has created a new and vibrant high quality civic space, which contributes to the establishment of safe, pleasant and well-designed public spaces within the Precinct. This Project follows on from the recently completed and award-winning refurbishment of the St Peters Town Hall Complex and provides safe and effective pedestrian and cycling connections to Payneham Road, Dunstone Grove-Linde Reserve, the River Torrens Linear Park and the St Peters Billabong.

Through innovative design, The Civic Plaza, which encompasses St Peters Street between First Lane and Payneham Road, is capable of temporary closure to through traffic, transforming the street

into a vibrant outdoor civic space for the staging of community events and activities.

Included also as part of this Project is the installation of a Major Public Artwork to commemorate the Centenary of ANZAC.

In 2006, the Council resolved to set aside 1% of its annual Capital Works program each year to fund a Major Public Artwork within each Council term. To complement the upgrade to St Peters Street, the Council resolved to dedicate its Major Quadrennial Public Artwork commission for the 2010-2014 term to the Centenary of ANZAC in 2015.

South Australian artists Gregg Mitchell and Greg Healey of Groundplay and Amy Joy Watson, were selected to produce this piece, and the end result was a structure titled *Fallow* – a steel and aluminium structure designed to commemorate the hardship and suffering endured during World War 1.

This artwork, together with the heritage listed War Memorial located at the intersection of St Peters Street and First Avenue, forms the bookmarks to the Avenue of Honour, which represents a contemporary and historic commemoration to all Australian Servicemen and Women killed in action.

The Council is very grateful to the support provided to these projects by both State and Federal Government, who combined contributed more than \$1 million towards the \$2.6 million budget.

The new public space that has been created through the St Peters Civic Plaza and Avenue of Honour Project, respects and celebrates the significant heritage of the area and the character of the Precinct, while generating vitality, innovation and social interaction, to enhance the wellbeing of our community.

# Felixstow Reserve Masterplan

In September 2014, the Council endorsed the Felixstow Reserve Masterplan Concept, which forms the first stage of the Felixstow Reserve Masterplan Project. **The Project's aim is to establish a framework for the redevelopment of this significant piece of open space**, in order to enhance and realise its full potential.

**As a result of submissions which have been received from the community, the Concept Plan was amended to include a smaller wetland area and three 200sqm bio-filtration beds located in the vicinity of the existing eastern car park.**

Incorporating bio-filtration beds into the design has enabled the Council to reduce the area of the wetland from 1.4 hectares to approximately 1 hectare, resulting in a larger open grassed area to be retained for the community to enjoy.

The other advantage of incorporating bio-filtration beds is that a section of the Reserve, which previously could not accommodate a wetland, can now be used for the treatment of stormwater through the inclusion of bio-filtration. The proposed bio-filtration beds will resemble a planted landscape area, similar to those constructed by the Council at Dunstone Grove-Linde Reserve at Stepney.

In addition to the wetland and the bio-filtration beds the Project will incorporate a network of pedestrian and cycle pathways, BBQ and picnic facilities throughout the Reserve, new public toilets and car parking at either end of the Reserve, as well as a drop off zone along Langman Grove.

Some of the other planned features include natural play space in the lower park area, fitness equipment located throughout the Reserve, a circular running track, a games and activity space and a multi-purpose court.

Working with Oxigen (Consulting Landscape Architects and Urban Designers), the Council has now commenced Stage 2 of the Project, which focuses on the preparation of the detailed Masterplan, taking into account the endorsed location and design of the wetland, and the feedback received to date from the community.

Once a Draft Masterplan has been developed and endorsed by the



Council, the community will again be given the opportunity to comment on the proposed redevelopment of Felixstow Reserve.

The Felixstow Reserve Masterplan continues to be undertaken concurrently with the Eastern Regional Alliance (ERA) Waterproofing Eastern Adelaide Stormwater Harvesting and Reuse Project, a \$28 Million regional project with the key objective to harvest and reuse stormwater for irrigation.

# Building Resilience Across The Eastern Region



**The City of Norwood Payneham & St Peters, in partnership with Adelaide City Council and the Cities of Burnside, Campbelltown, Prospect, Unley, Tea Tree Gully and the Town of Walkerville, is leading *Resilient East*, an initiative to strengthen the ability of the eastern region of metropolitan Adelaide to respond to changes in our climate.**

The recent Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's Fifth Assessment Report clearly stated that without urgent action to slash greenhouse gas emissions, "warming by the end of the 21st century will lead to high to very high risk of severe, widespread and irreversible impacts globally". Cities, where the majority of people live, are where positive change can happen.

*Resilient East* will increase the resilience of the natural and built environment through facilitating community support networks and partnerships for the sharing of resources and skills.

It will outline tangible and strategic regional actions that will reduce the impacts of climate change across Adelaide's eastern region.

Over 80 people attended the first Resilient East key stakeholder workshop on 18 November 2014. They represented expertise in assets, water and infrastructure management, emergency management, business and economic development, sustainable development, natural environment, open space, social and community resilience and health.

The workshop sought participant's views on what they currently value, the key decisions they face in their sector and the vision they want for the eastern region in the coming decades.

The values identified at this workshop, together with a regional profile report and the latest regional modelling of future changes to the climate, will contribute to the next workshop occurring in early 2015, where key stakeholders will assess where the greatest impacts and vulnerability exists.

## Draft Residential Development (Zones & Policy Areas) Development Plan Amendment

**The Council is proposing changes to all residential zones throughout the City through the draft Residential Development (Zones & Policy Areas) Development Plan Amendment (DPA).**

The draft DPA has undergone two separate rounds of public consultation - the first during 2012-2013 and the second during early 2014. The Council received approximately 400 submissions from residents and property owners on various aspects of the proposed policies.

Following consideration of the submissions the Council made a number of changes to the draft policies, particularly in relation to reducing building heights and densities in some locations.

The Council's Strategic Planning & Development Policy Committee has now endorsed a final draft DPA, which was submitted to the Minister for Planning for approval in September 2014. The Minister can choose to approve, reject or recommend further changes to the policies; and it is anticipated that this should occur by early 2015.

The 2014 Adelaide Fashion Festival kicked off on 16 October, with **16 events** held throughout Adelaide across ten days.

**One of the stand-out events was the SA Designers Showcase presented by Renniks Hire, held at the Adelaide Gaol. Twenty local designers (including eight competing for the Emerging Designer Award Presented by Republic) showcased their latest collections to a sold-out crowd of more than 400 guests.**

Two new events - the SA Collective Clothing Sale and the 'Behind the Seams' Q&A Workshop - were also held this year. The SA Collective Clothing Sale provided local boutiques and designers the opportunity to sell their goods at a one-day super sale in the Norwood Concert Hall; while the Behind the Seams Q&A Workshop, provided rare insights into the world of fashion with a variety of industry insiders sharing their stories.

The pinnacle event - Norwood Place Parades on Norwood Parade - was once again a favourite for families and fashionistas of all ages. For the first time, three parades were held throughout the day, with the inclusion of a 'SA Designers' Parade featuring TAFE students, local and emerging designers, alongside the other two parades featuring Parade traders.

The much loved Norwood Market was a hit once again, with the inclusion of the new SA Designers Hub, created to showcase local and emerging designers who participated in the Festival.

A highlight of this year's Festival was Fashion Icons at the Art Gallery of South Australia. 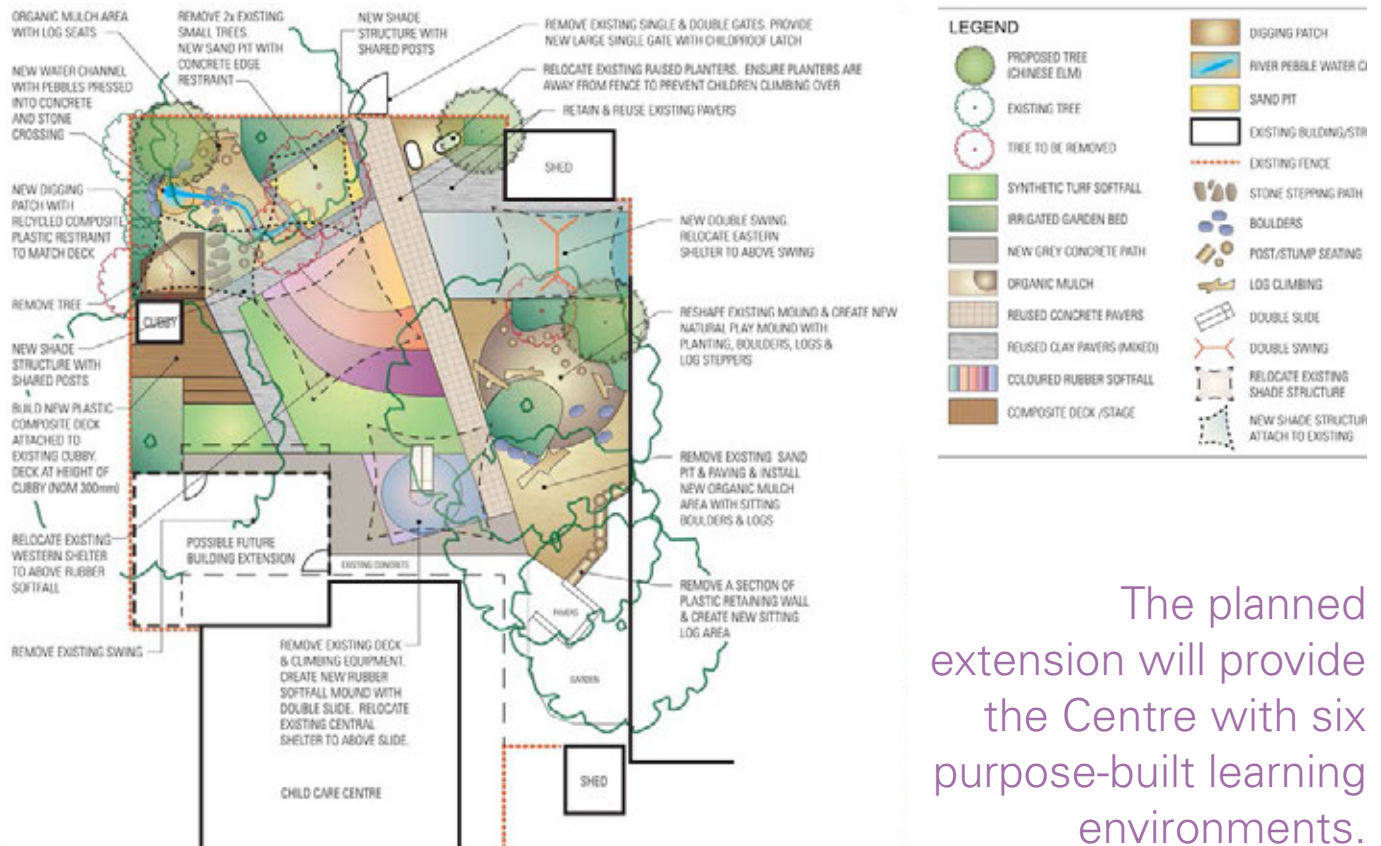

# St Peters Child Care Centre & Preschool Expansion



The planned extension will provide the Centre with six purpose-built learning environments.

## The St Peters Child Care Centre & Preschool is about to expand, with work on the new building extension to commence in 2015.

Once complete, the Centre's capacity will increase from eighty to ninety child care places on a daily basis, effectively creating an additional fifty places each week.

The planned extension will provide the Centre with six purpose-built learning environments, but more importantly, will also provide flexibility to adapt age group configurations to better meet community demand for child care places.

The outdoor play area which overlooks Dunstone Grove-Linde Reserve is also being redeveloped, and work will start on this once the building extension is completed.

This will include the relocation of shade structures, new swings and slide, decking and soft fall. The relocated sandpit and new digging patches will be separated by a dry creek bed and water channel; and the outdoor play area will also incorporate quiet play areas, where children can sit amongst the plants and observe birds and other insects.

This project supports the Centre's Quality Improvement Plan, with the aim of providing a more naturalised environment with opportunities for children to grow plants, experience different textures and plants and have access to water.

Staff at the Centre are excited about these planned developments, which will result in a state of the art facility and learning environment for local children and families within the community.

The Norwood, Payneham and St Peters Libraries provide a range of services and programs that support people with accessibility and vision difficulties.

## Library Bus and Home Library Service

If you are unable to come into the Library due to age, frailty, accessibility issues or ill health, the Home Library Service or the Library Bus may be able to assist you.

Home Library customers can enjoy full access to library items for loan and request items for loan at any time. Each month a selection of library items are prepared and delivered to Council residents in their home, and the previous month's materials collected by registered Council Volunteers or Library staff. Available items include fiction and non fiction titles, magazines, DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, and large print titles.

The Library Bus is a monthly service which can pick residents up from their home, to visit and borrow materials from the St Peters Library.

## Merlin Ultra Electronic Magnifier

If reading normal sized print text is difficult, the Merlin HD is an electronic magnifier that can be used to enlarge reading materials to suit your vision needs.

A Merlin HD is now available at the Payneham Library, thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Norwood Payneham & St Peters Libraries. The Merlin HD is easy to use, and can even be used to change the colour of fonts and backgrounds to make reading coloured print materials easier.

## Daisy Player

The Norwood Payneham & St Peters Libraries also have four Daisy Players for loan which can be used with any audiobook discs held within the Library collections, or with titles supplied by Vision Australia. Residents using the players can receive titles in the post, and once read they can be posted back in the reply paid envelope and Vision Australia will send on the next title. The Libraries can also facilitate residents renting their own Daisy Player from Vision Australia for \$7.00 per month.

## Audiobook and Large Print Collections

The Libraries also stock a large number of CD audiobooks, and large print fiction and nonfiction titles to suit a variety of tastes.

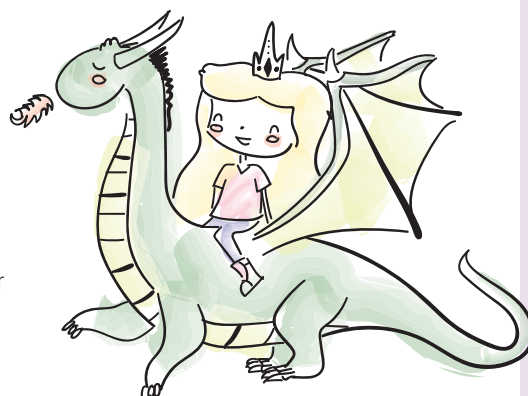

# Norwood Concert Hall Nears its First Century

**The Norwood Concert Hall is one of South Australia's most important venues for the performing arts and as part of the iconic Norwood Town Hall, it has been a source of local pride for many generations. It is also a lasting tribute to the former Mayor Henry James Holden, who was the driving force in building the Concert Hall in 1914. Henry Holden was a member of one of South Australia's most prominent business families and founder of the motor vehicle manufacturing firm of Holden's.**

Architect EH McMichael drafted plans for an impressive concert space that could cater for 1650 patrons. However, the Council would only approve the Concert Hall extensions if it was sanctioned by a poll and a public meeting of ratepayers who subsequently did agree to support the Council's decision and financial expenditure on the project. Work on the Hall commenced on 7 November 1914, when Mayoress Mary Holden laid the foundation stone. Less than one year, and £13,000 later, construction was completed.

The Norwood Concert Hall opened on 31 August 1915 and its official launch was celebrated with a three day program when more than 4,500 patrons enjoyed non-stop entertainment put on by the Council. With the declaration of war, it immediately became the centre for numerous patriotic functions during the First World War (1914-1918), with dances and concerts regularly staged, as well as fundraising events supporting soldiers serving in the AIF in Egypt and in Europe.

Architect EH McMichael gave special attention to the acoustic properties in his designs and in 1922, the Concert Hall became the home for the newly formed Kensington & Norwood Municipal Orchestra, which gave its inaugural performance on the 22 August, 1922.

Australia's world famous soprano Dame Nellie Melba was one of the most celebrated stars to grace the Hall in the 1920s. Throughout the Second World War, the Hall again hosted a range of patriotic events, and then more recently in 1995, a concert was held to mark the 50th anniversary of the end of WW2. The Hall featured prominently in the program for Adelaide's first Festival of the Arts in the 1960's, before being seriously damaged by fire in the late 1970s.

Since its relaunch in 1990, with a concert by famed jazz trumpeter James Morrison, the Hall has made an appearance in the film *Shine*, and hosted groups as diverse as The Wiggles, Slim Dusty, and American orchestral composer John Williams.

Today the building is still used extensively for Australia Day celebrations and Citizenship Ceremonies, as well as a range of other musical performances and community events. The 2015 Fringe Festival will include a number of performances in the Hall (see page 25 for further details), and on 30-31 January 2015, it will host a performance from one of Norwood's favourite sons, Paul Kelly.

Almost one hundred years after opening night, the Norwood Concert Hall remains a community-centred venue, and is available for hire to the general public. For bookings contact Norwood Concert Hall Venue Manager Ebanney Willox on 8366 4557 or email ewilox@npsp.sa.gov.au
